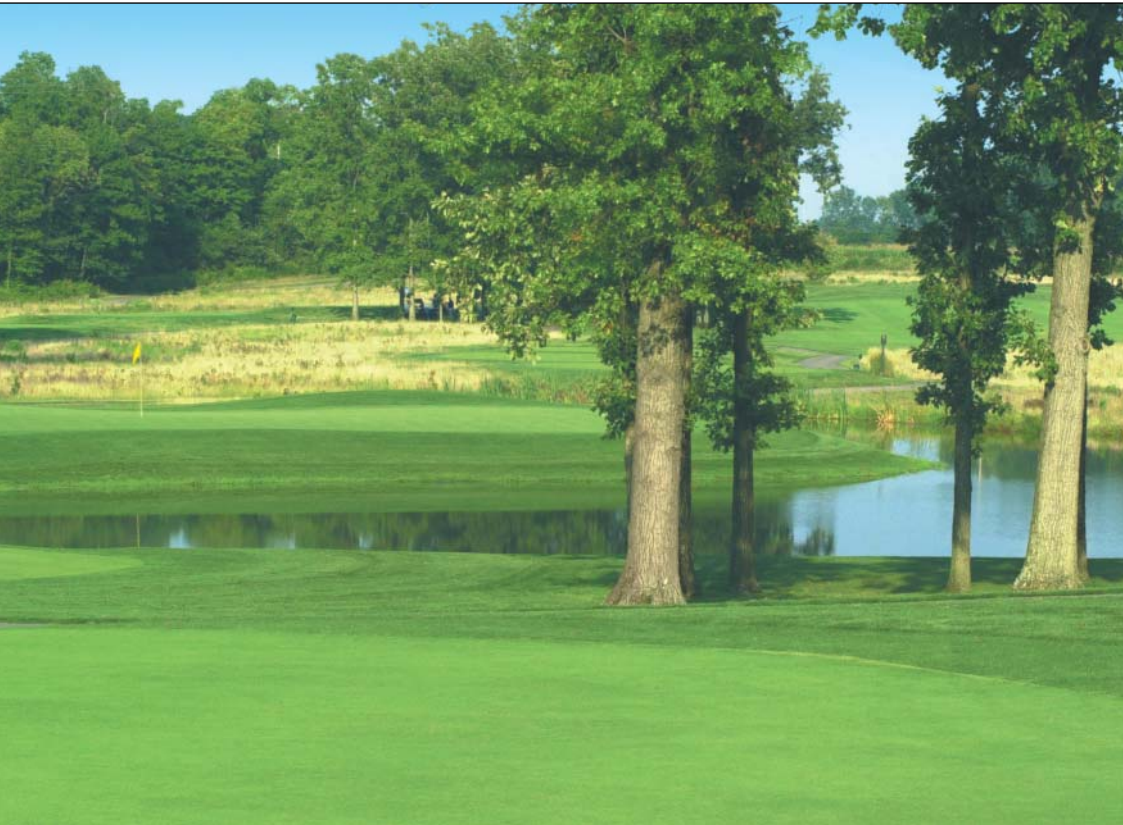

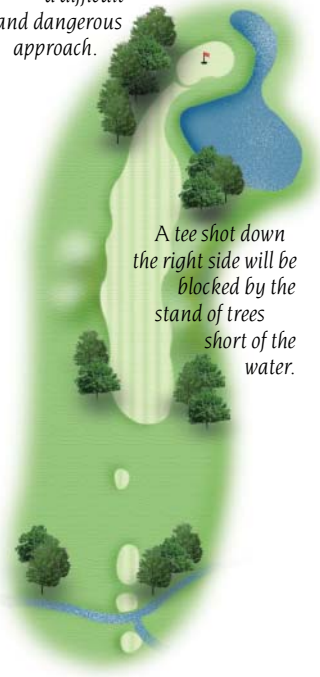
No. 4

HOLE No. 4 PAR four YARDS 412

This is the approach shot that faces players on this treacherous, 412-yard par four. To get to this spot, the tee shot must carry the crest of the hill on the left side of the fairway, avoiding the trees on the right. Water is dangerously close on the front, right and back of this peninsula green, making the approach to this shallow green one of the hardest on the course. There is a bailout on the left side, which provides an opportunity to chip and save par.



A front, right pin position makes this a difficult and dangerous approach.



A tee shot down the right side will be blocked by the stand of trees short of the water.
